*From the Pastor ~*

On January 22, 1973 the United States Supreme Court handed down its Roe v Wade decision establishing legalized abortion in our country. Since this decision over 50 million abortions have taken place in our country. Each year over one million abortions take place, this amounts to over 3000 a day. What our culture refers to as a choice is the ending of a human life. How different our world would be if those 50 million had been given a chance to live. And these are only statistics for our country, as many more take place around the world.

This weekend we remember and pray for life. Hundreds of thousands of people will march for life in Washington DC tomorrow. I have had the privilege and opportunity to participate in the March for Life in our nation's capital when I attended the seminary in Baltimore, and it is a powerful witness to the need to end abortion and all those things that deny human dignity. If you know of anyone that has had an abortion or supported or procured an abortion for another, please urge that person to come to the sacrament of reconciliation.

We make our prayer this weekend to end abortion, but also for the hearts that desire abortion. Our culture is impulsive, and not respecting the dignity of the human person, that every person has inherent human dignity. For this reason we feed people that are hungry, and provide clothing for those that need them. We stand for life and oppose the values of the culture of death. A great way to support life is to support the great effort of the Visitation House in Worcester.

# St. Bernadette School News



The St. Bernadette School student body increased last week as six Korean students joined our school during their Winter break. Four students will attend SBS for 3 weeks and two will attend for 6 weeks. They have been warmly welcomed by new classmates and teachers. Each student has been assigned a "buddy" who serves as a St. Bernadette School ambassador and friend. They assist with clarifying directions and activities, packing up homework and, in general, needs that may arise as these students navigate in their temporary school in a new language. It is wonderful to watch our students demonstrate character, compassion and values toward their new peers. For their part, many of the Korean students have studied English for five years or more. Their math computation skills are well-developed; clarification helps with word problem-solving and of course, in other content areas. It is the colloquial expressions that can sometimes be the most puzzling! The students remain from 3:00-5:00 PM three days a week for additional tutoring. Students and faculty are enjoying this learning experience!

Each year St. Bernadette School students have an opportunity to participate in the performing arts. The entire school performs in the annual Christmas Concert at the school's traditional observance of the Nativity story. The Spring musical provides our performers with another creative option. Next week students in grades 4-8 will be auditioning for a role in the Spring musical production of "Annie." Sign up sheets for try-outs after school are posted outside Mrs. Davis and Mrs. Legendre's classrooms.

Re-registration materials for the 2012-2013 school were mailed last week. More than 50 new families have requested application forms. It is clear that there will be waiting lists in several grade levels. Please be certain to return the re-registration forms and fee by the January 27, 2012 deadline. If you miss the deadline we cannot guarantee that there will be a spot for your child. There will be two Open House events. The first will be Sunday, January 29th from 1:00-3:00PM and the second on Thursday, February 2nd from 10:00AM-1:00PM. Invitations have been mailed to all those who have inquired about admissions.

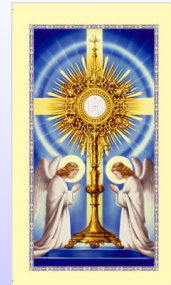
