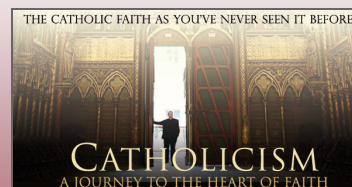

**John 6:48**

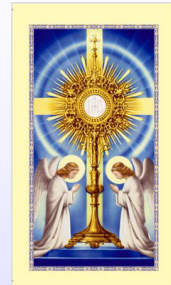

## St. Bernadette School News

"Happy Catholic Schools Week!" said a prospective parent as she entered the front lobby for Open House. The mother went on to explain that her family recently relocated to the area from Harrisburg, PA., where she had taught in a Catholic school. She was interested in enrolling her daughter and shared that she was feeling a little lost not being with children and celebrating Catholic Schools Week (CSW.) We could relate to that since CSW is a highlight of the school year for all Catholic schools across the United States and Canada! This year was no exception.

Beginning with the theme "Catholic Schools: Faith. Academics. Service." the entire school community had an opportunity to reflect on the fundamental hallmarks of Catholic education throughout the week. During the opening Mass, Fr. Gemme shared his experiences as a Catholic school educator before he was ordained and affirmed the joy of being Headmaster at St. Bernadette School before joining a large crowd at a Pancake Brunch in the Charbonneau Center. Father also served as a most gracious host of our first Open House of the Week, meeting and greeting families interested in learning more about enrollment opportunities. On Monday parents and volunteers were invited to a morning coffee where they were entertained by our choir and received a small gift in appreciation of their service to our school. Tuesday was "Student Appreciation Day" and students thoroughly enjoyed special class activities and a laser light and music show by Prismatic Magic. The older students attended a science presentation where they learned more about the science of lasers and then were joined by the younger classes for a rousing "Tribute to America" show. The show was funded in part by the Northboro Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency. Wednesday morning we celebrated our school in the community, inviting the parishioners to brunch after morning Mass. Once again, the choir performed a selection of liturgical music for our guests. Students had created beautiful cards for everyone and each parishioner received a small appreciation gift. Thursday was our second Open House of the week. Many parents volunteered to serve as tour guides and were assisted by members of the eighth grade class. Prospective families toured as classes were in session and learned about our program and practices from both parent and student perspectives. The school was beautifully decorated with class projects and art work created in Mrs. Lapolito and Mrs. Lien's art classes. We concluded our celebration of Catholic Schools Week with Mass led by members of the sixth grade class and the choir. After Mass each student, teacher and guest present was also able to have their throat blessed in observance of the Feast of St. Blasé.

Sadly, we said goodbye to three of our student visitors from Korea and to several other students who are moving out of state. It has become a tradition to present all of our graduates and departing students with a St. Bernadette medal. The gesture is intended to remind students that they will always be members of our school family. ## **Novena Helps Cancer Survivors**

NORTHBOROUGH – Eve Lindquist was diagnosed with a rare form of intestinal cancer. She endured six surgeries and 27 courses of radiation.

In February of 2006, she and her husband, Russell, attended the Novena to Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Bernadette, held each year at St. Bernadette Parish. “We prayed for a total healing, and it happened,” she recalled. This year marks the 20th anniversary of the novena, named after Our Blessed Mother’s apparition in Lourdes, France to Saint Bernadette Soubirous. Lourdes is now a famous Catholic pilgrimage site.

Many favors have been granted to the faithful who come to pray at St. Bernadette Parish each February, according to pastor Father Stephen M. Gemme. He said people travel to the novena from all around the Worcester Diocese and also from the neighboring Archdiocese of Boston.

Following the novena, Mrs. Lindquist started to feel much better. She regained her strength. She felt healthy again. At the end of 2006, she told her husband she wanted to go back to work. Soon after, she found a position as executive director of Visitation House in Worcester, a home for pregnant women in crisis.

“It’s a miracle,” she said about her recovery and her job of helping women in need. “The Blessed Mother sent me to this house.”

The position is demanding and the hours are long. Yet, Mrs. Lindquist, 67, despite being so sick at one point, is up to the task. “I’m completely healed,” she noted.

Mrs. Lindquist is acutely aware of the power of prayer, which can bring dramatic healing. Before her diagnosis, she worked at St. Paul Cathedral’s rectory, preparing meals for seven priests, including Bishop Emeritus Reilly. All of them, she said, were praying for her.

The Lindquists also went to the Our Lady of Lourdes novena at St. Bernadette, which is their parish, prior to the cancer diagnosis. Now, though, they don’t miss a year. Mr. Lindquist goes each of the nine nights. Mrs. Lindquist does too, unless she’s out of town. Even then, she still prays the novena from a prayer booklet.

Kathleen McShane, another member of St. Bernadette’s, also had cancer. It came as a shock, during a routine visit to her dentist five years ago.

“I don’t like the look of that tooth,” she was told.

Mrs. McShane has endured a grueling schedule of five surgeries, in an attempt to keep her cancer at bay. When we spoke, she’d recently had another procedure. But it was successful, she reported.

“I don’t have it anymore,” she said. “I have no cancer right now.”

Because the cancer was in her mouth, surgeons have removed part of her jaw. This has affected her speech. She also has no salivary glands, requiring her to always have water on hand.

For Mrs. McShane, life has changed. She was once a lector at St. Bernadette’s. She was very involved in different ministries. No longer able to drive, she depends on friends from church to take her to Mass. She is no longer able to attend the annual March for Life in Washington, DC. Yet, Mrs. McShane realizes she’s also incredibly fortunate.

“I’m grateful to be alive,” she said.

“Yes, I would never stop thanking God for my blessings,” she added. “Never.”

Father Gemme said the Novena to Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Bernadette has evolved in its 20 years of existence. Originally, it was more of a local event, with the pastor of the parish preaching for nine nights.

Now, this year, each of the nine nights will feature a different speaker. Bishop McManus will open the novena on Feb. 10 at 7 p.m. Bishop Emeritus Daniel P. Reilly will close the novena on Feb. 18. Both bishops will offer Mass on those nights.

On Feb. 18, the church will be adorned with visible proof of the power of prayer.

“On the last night of the novena, people will bring a yellow rose if they feel their prayer has been answered and also to honor Our Lady, and many people bring flowers forward during the last night, and the entire sanctuary of the Church will be filled with yellow roses,” said Father Gemme.
