*From the Pastor ~*

This week we return to what the Church calendar calls Ordinary Time. The Latin *Tempus Per Annum* ("time throughout the year") is rendered into English as "Ordinary Time." Many sources, online and in print, suggest that Ordinary Time gets its name from the word *ordinal*, meaning "numbered," since the Sundays of Ordinary Time, as in other seasons, are expressed numerically.

According to The General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, the days of Ordinary Time, especially the Sundays, "are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects." Basically, Ordinary Time encompasses that part of the Christian year that does not fall within the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter.

Ordinary time does not need to be "ordinary," and is not meant to mean that somehow we get a break from the Liturgical Year. The opposite is true: Ordinary Time celebrates "the mystery of Christ in all its aspects." Many important liturgical celebrations fall during Ordinary Time, including, Trinity, Corpus Christi, All Saints, the Assumption of Mary, and Christ the King.

In addition, the Church continues to celebrate Saints days and other events such as The Octave of Christian Unity. The major feasts, when occurring on a Sunday, trump the regular Ordinary Time Sunday lessons and liturgy. In the American Catholic Church, Corpus Christi is usually transferred to a Sunday, so often there are fewer than the 33 or 34 Sundays labeled "Sundays of Ordinary Time," although these Sundays still fall within Ordinary Time. We also may remember and celebrate the parts of Jesus' life that were ordinary, much like our own lives. The color of green is appropriate because it is the most ordinary color in our natural environment.

Our parish school has its open house in two weeks on January 29 for the beginning of Catholic School's week. Please let your friends and neighbors know that all are welcome. And don't forget our 20th Annual Novena beginning on February 10, 2011 in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Bernadette. Bishop McManus will preside at the opening Mass.

Happy New Year! The students returned from the Christmas break both rested and excited. Faculty, staff and administrators felt much the same but, like the students, have quickly transitioned to the rhythm and routines of school once again. It was a busy week for all.

We welcomed 5 new students this past week and two additional staff members. The five students have transferred from both local schools and from Korea. The new staff members include Mrs. Laura Enos who is assisting Ms. French in Grade 2C and Mrs. Michele Walsh who has begun a new era in her career as both a St. Bernadette School parent and Magazine Drive Coordinator-extraordinaire. Mrs. Walsh is the new Business Manager for the school. She is working with Mrs. Halloran and Mrs. Williams in the Parish Business Office and will gradually assume responsibility for the School's business affairs. It is expected that the transition will be fully in place at the start of the new fiscal year in September.

On Monday St. Bernadette School community expanded to include six students from Korea who will be joining us for several weeks. 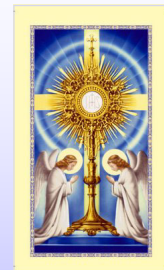

## **What is a Vocation?**

In the simplest terms, "vocation" means a "call." So, in general terms your vocation is what God calls you to do with your life. Everybody is called by God to know, love and serve him. The difference is how each one does this.

Individual vocations vary between being single, married, consecrated, religious or a priest. However, we usually use "Vocation" to mean a call to the consecrated, religious or priestly life but the principles and much of the advice are also applicable to the married and the single life. . In the one life God gave you to live, you have one overriding purpose, to fulfill the will of God, because this is the key to your true destiny, eternal happiness.

God gives each one of us a particular mission in life. As we grow and life progresses, he makes it known to us, usually in indirect ways, more as an invitation than an imposition. Discovering and ultimately following your vocation gives the greatest glory and praise to our Creator. It is what we were meant to do.

"Take up your cross and follow me" (Mark 8:34).

## **What is a priest?**

A priest is a man who has received the Sacrament of Holy Orders, which confers on him certain powers of Christ, principally the power to consecrate bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, and the power to forgive sin in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. When he does these things he acts in the Person of Christ.

## **What is a diocesan priest?**

A diocesan priest is one who is called to serve souls in a particular diocese. The Bishop has been placed by Christ as the head of that diocese, and the diocesan priest serves in obedience to and collaboration with him, serving mostly in parishes. On a practical level you can say that the Church "runs" on diocesan priests serving in their parishes. They administer the sacraments, they are responsible for the instruction of their people, they are close to them in their lives and trials, they counsel, forgive and serve constantly, heroically, patiently.

## **What is religious life?**

The people who live religious life are called "Religious". Religious seek to follow Christ more closely by publicly professing the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience in a recognized religious order, giving public witness of their consecration by wearing a religious habit, and they live in community.

There are religious orders or communities of men and of women. Women religious are nuns and male religious can be either priests or brothers. Religious communities often refer to themselves as "religious families". Each has its own Founder and mission, and its own "family spirit" or spirituality. That is why if you are considering religious life it is necessary to get to know particular communities.

## **What is a religious priest?**

A religious priest is a member of a religious community who has received the Sacrament of Orders. He is under the authority of his own superiors, and he serves the local diocese through the works of his order or congregation located there. However he is not limited to serving in one diocese but can be assigned elsewhere by his superiors. Everywhere he serves he does so with the permission of the local bishop. Some religious priests serve in parishes, but the majority have more specialized apostolates, such as education, retreats, communications, etc.

## **What is contemplative or monastic life?**

The contemplative dedicates much time to prayer each day, lives mostly in silence and also is dedicated to manual labor. There is a great tradition in the Church of both female and male monastic and contemplative life. Their hidden prayer and sacrifice is of major importance for the overall good of the Church.
